Shaping the Future of Water Polo in Saskatchewan

Over the last few years, Saskatchewan water polo teams have had unprecedented success on the National scene. We have had 7 "top 4" finishes at Nationals, including 2 National Championship teams, and won several regional tournaments. Our athletes, both male and female, have been regularly selected to tournament All Star teams, Youth, Junior, and Senior National teams. Many athletes from Saskatchewan have relocated to train with the National Training Centres.

While performance on a national scale has been highlighted in the past few years, the number of athletes participating in interprovincial tournaments has not increased. This season, Water Polo Saskatchewan is introducing a program to address the reduced numbers. The program will focus on athletes,

both boys and girls, born 1988-1992. The primary short term goal of the program is to perform at the 2006 Youth Cup.

A secondary goal this season is to generate excitement and interest in all aspects of water polo - playing, coaching, officiating, and volunteering. Hopefully, this program will assist clubs in attracting and retaining athletes by providing long term National level goals, and a local program to support training and competition.

The program is not intended to be an elitist model. It is intended to enhance club training. All athletes born 1988-1992 are invited to participate. I hope that all athletes will participate, thereby becoming better water polo players and enriching their life skills, enjoying some fantastic company and wonderful experiences.

The Youth Provincial Pro-

gram is available to all members, but initially, WPS will focus mainly on enhancing club programming in Estevan, Weyburn, Regina, and Saskatoon. The program will train all aspects of the game including, swimming, passing and shooting, various techniques, strategies and tactics, mental training, nutrition, strength training, flexibility.

Athletes will attend 7 Provincial Camps, 5 competitions, and spend 700 hours over the next 11 months preparing to achieve our goals.

On September 9th, we will host an open information session. The first camp is September 10-11, in Regina. Please register through the WPS office. I am excited to be leading this program, and honoured that Water Polo Saskatchewan has selected me. I hope to see you all on September 9th.

Congratulations Kevin and Noah -2005 World Aquatic Championships in Montreal

The Canadian men's water polo team rallied from a 6-3 first half deficit in their last game of the 2005 World

Aquatic Championships in Montreal to defeat Japan 10-8. They concluded the tournament in 13th place. Kevin Graham (the youngest player on the team) and Noah Miller, both of Regina each scored a goal. The Canadians were winless in their three

round robin games and were relegated to the consolation round. They defeated China 11-5 on Sunday before edging the Japanese. The Canadian women played in the semi-final against Russia and captured the bronze medal.

Presidents Message

Water Polo Saskatchewan (WPS) is the provincial sport governing body responsible for the development and administration of water polo in the province. WPS is a non-profit corporation, first registered with the Department of Consumer and Corporate Affairs in 1975 and is an active member of Sask Sport Incorporated, a non-profit, nongovernment federation of Provincial Sport Governing Bodies, and also the Canadian Water Polo Association, the body governing the sport of water polo in Canada.

As a member of Sask Sport Inc., WPS is eligible to receive grants via the Saskatchewan Lotteries. These grants combined with selfhelp revenue generated through membership, fundraising and program fees, are used for initiating and implementing programs for the grassroots to elite levels, as well as for administrative costs for our office, staff and programs.

Our members are comprised of water polo clubs and programs and individuals including; coaches, athletes, officials and parents. WPS is governed by an elected Board of Directors, comprised of a Chair, Vice-Chair and six other board members. In 2003, Water Polo Saskatchewan adopted a Policy Governance model that outlines the main responsibilities of the Board to include:

- Maintain a health y relationships with members and stakeholders and gather their input and feedback
- Determine what impact the organization wishes to have and direct strategic priorities towards these ends
- Delegate authority and responsibility Monitor and measure organizational activity.

It gives me great pleasure in welcoming you to this, our first Newsletter, which is a direct result of the clear message from our Member Survey, conducted last fall where a lack of communication was highlighted as a concern.

Miranda Biletski, a 16-year-old water polo and speed swimming athlete, was injured in a diving block accident on June 6th, 2005. Paralyzed below the C6 vertebrae of her spine, nothing is about to get in her way.

Miranda is currently in the Wascana Rehabilitation Centre in Regina. She has done very well with her therapy and continues to do so. Miranda has no feeling below her sternum and has limited movement in her hands. Rolling over and tossing a ball are in her regular therapy sessions. Miranda's parents Sharon and Bentley are very proud of her and are in high spirits for the future. Ryan, Miranda's brother, has been the one keeping her laughing.

Miranda's room is painted with greeting cards, pictures, posters, and teddy bears. The support from all over the province has been amazing. Although her room is awesome, Miranda hopes to move in back home. The Biletski family is in the process of renovat-

ing their home for Miranda to move around more easily. If all goes to plan, Miranda will be home in September.

Education is another obstacle that Miranda faces. She is taking English and Math by correspondence for the first semester and then will go back to Leboldus High School in the second semester. Miranda has a lot to do in the future. She plans on going to Project Walk in San Diego for spinal cord injuries, is going to play paralympic sports, and hopes to get back into swimming.

Many people are inspired by Miranda's attitude. She has had Mike Mintenko, Canadian Olympic speed swimmer, visit her while she was in the hospital. Catriona Le May Doan, Olympic speed skater, was astounded by Miranda's strength, and Mary Lou Retton, former Olympic gymnast, sent some words of encouragement. These people are few of the many that are moved by Miranda's courage.

The summer speed swimming community has been there all summer supporting Miranda. There has been a variety of fund-

raisers at swim meets that has brought in large amounts of money for Miranda, \$1.00 from every swimmer in each swim meet was donated to the Miranda Biletski Trust Fund, and there have been over 2000 Miranda Will bracelets sold. There have been many individual donations from all over Saskatchewan that has given the Miranda Biletski Trust Fund over \$18,000 so
